Appears as part of the Stockport Circuit between April 1952 and the present. This church is sometimes also referred to as Edgeley Road Methodist Church. Services were temporarily held in the hall of St Matthew's CofE Church whilst the building was re-built in the early 1970s.

Jubilee Methodist Church

The church was founded in 1833 as Compstall Primitive Methodist Chapel. It was rebuilt in 1867 and extended to two storeys in 1893, at which time it was re-named Jubilee.

Levenshulme Methodist Church (Alma Park)

Address: Alma Park, 824 Stockport Rd, Levenshulme, Manchester, M19 3AW.

Appears as part of the Stockport Circuit between April 1929 and July 1937. It is now part of the Manchester Circuit. The church was built in 1863, with the foundation stone laid in April 1864.



Key Event in Stockport Circuit

1809: the first Methodist circuit is established in Stockport.

1909: centenary celebrations for the Stockport South (Mount Tabor) Circuit.

1952: a major reorganisation of churches and circuits south of the river. 5 churches become part of the Stockport Circuit for the first time.

1964: the two Methodist circuits in Stockport (north and south of the River Mersey) merged together. The Tiviot Dale and Mount Tabor circuits become the Stockport Circuit, incorporating 14 churches and 7 ministers.

1971: the new Trinity Methodist opens on Bramhall Lane. It emerged from the closure and merger of three other churches: Mount Tabor, Trinity (Zion) and Woodsmoor.

2019: the United Stockport and Hazel Grove circuits merged.

2020: the United Stockport and Romiley circuits merged.
