Craft Club



Our Saturday Afternoon Filmshow on 1st March at 2 p.m. will be the 2019 Christian-genre true-life drama "**BREAKTHROUGH**," which tells the story of John Smith, a 14-year-old lad from Guatemala, being raised by his adoptive parents, Brian and Joyce, in Lake St Louis, Missouri. They are loving, Christian folk, but John is rebellious at home and at school, and on 19th January 2015, he and his two teenage friends ignore warnings not to go onto a frozen lake, and fall through when the ice breaks. His companions swim to the surface and are rescued, but the first responders who dive in fail to find John. But firefighter Tommy Shine hears a voice telling him to go back, tries again, finds John, and brings him out (15 minutes after he fell in). In hospital, not breathing, and with no pulse, an emergency team tries to revive him, but after 45 minutes in total, there is no sign of life. His Mum is brought in to say goodbye to him, and holds him in her arms, praying and pleading with God to not let him die. And at that point, something extraordinary happens...

It's a film about faith, hope, love, family relationships, pride getting in the way of progress, and not giving up.
