





Music for Pleasure on Thursday 20th March is at 2 p.m. in the Church, when Brian Thornley, our organist, will take to the piano and play selections of a wide range of pieces chosen at random by the audience from the Star Folio music editions. This will be followed with a cuppa and a posh biscuit - all welcome!

Our Saturday Afternoon Filmshow (for the Easter season) on 5th April at 2 p.m. will be the 1953 Biblical epic "THE ROBE," which tells the story of Marcellus, a Roman military tribune (played by Richard Burton) who commands the unit that is responsible for the crucifixion of Jesus and two robbers, and whose mind is haunted afterwards by what he's done. He wins Jesus' robe in a dice game at Calvary, and it's this robe, regarded as cursed by some, but as a miraclemaker by others, that forms the title of the film. The other main characters are Demetrius, a Greek slave (Victor Mature) who becomes Marcellus' personal servant; Diana (Jean Simmons), an item with Marcellus; the Apostle Peter (Michael Rennie); the Roman Emperor Caligula, the villain of the piece (Jay Robinson, in a somewhat unrestrained performance); & Pontius Pilate, he of the washing hands (Richard Boone). "The Robe" was the first film to be shot in the new widescreen process of Cinemascope, and was directed by Henry Koster, with a screenplay adapted from Lloyd C Douglas's 1942 novel of the same title (Lloyd C Douglas was a Minister turned novelist). The music score was by the ever-reliable Alfred Newman. Richard Burton didn't think very highly of his own performance, or of the film, but had to agree that it was "an almighty hit" - and it got him an Oscar nomination (along with 5 others for the film). It's a film that has everything - action, love, hate, and a great, inspiring story


