Dear All

I am writing to see whether you have anyone in your churches who might be interested in following the Methodist Church's Worship: Leading and Preaching course with me and others?

This course was introduced a few years ago and is proving popular, because it is accessible and practical. The first part of the course is followed by people who want to be Worship Leaders or Local Preachers, the second half is for LPs - and people who started thinking they were going to be WLs can easily carry on and follow the LP material.

However, the course can also be a good way for people who are already WL / LPs to carry out continuing development, refreshing their thinking about worship and it could well be of interest to anyone who wants to explore more about worship

Here is the link to the WLP material https://www.methodist.org.uk/for-churches/ministries/lpwl/wlp/introducing-wlp/ You will see that there is a guest login, so you can look at the material.

There is a total of eight modules - each with three sections. WLs tackle the first four modules and LPs go on to study modules 5-8 as well. Each Section comprises:

- Short personal worship
- A Learn" section which is the major input
- An "Explore" section, where we reflect together on the topic, and
- A project normally a practical example, such as identifying where you might find
 resources when planning worship, examining ways to use a selected Bible passage or
 writing about an aid to prayer you might prepare for your local church.

We typically take around two months to tackle each section (thus completing four modules in around two years) but we can adjust this to suit the group.

I'm keen to start working on this with a new group. Please could you let me know if this is of interest to you or someone you know
