NEWS FROM AROUND THE CIRCUIT

Marple Methodist Church

Davenport Methodist Church

Mission through Music (MtM), is a relaxed informal way to worship. Using songs and hymns, prayers and thoughts, mostly on the text chosen for that day, and held on alternate months. Music and singing are lead from the front by the band, which is made up of 1 keyboard, two guitars and a flute, with four singers, who with more lively songs will add the sound of the tambourines.

The band starts with usually around four songs or hymns at 10.30am, leading into worship at 10.45am. There is usually eight songs and hymns during the service.

Traditionally, the final segment of the service often involves prayers for individuals and global situations.

The theme for May 18, 2025, was 'Moments that change lives,' which examined simple events that prompt people to reconsider the direction and purpose of their lives. Biblical examples include Paul on the Damascus Road and Zaccheus meeting Jesus. Previous themes included Abigail as an example of faithful living while dealing with a difficult husband (1 Samuel 25:2-44), and Peter's character and faithfulness.

In all it is a joyful meaningful, true worship of our God.

- blackcurrant squash







Our July film on 5th July at 2 p.m. is the 2019 true-life biographical drama "JUST MERCY," which tells the story of the crusading and idealistic young black lawyer Bryan Stevenson (played by Michael B Jordan), fresh out of Harvard in 1989, who heads to the Deep South of the USA and opens a legal centre in Alabama, to represent prisoners on Death Row, helped by his legal partner Eva Ansley (Brie Larson). One of his first (rather reluctant) clients is Walter McMillan, known to his friends as Johnny D (Jamie Foxx), a black man sitting on Death Row for a murder he didn't commit. As Bryan digs deeper into the case, a terrible injustice becomes apparent, as well as a lot of racial discrimination, which Bryan himself also has to face. This is a powerful, well-acted film, with some superb courtroom scenes, and all the better for being based on real events. Entry by donation, with tea and cakes during the interval - all welcome


District Online Worship: Pentecost Sunday, 8th June at 6.30pm
