NEWS FROM AROUND THE CIRCUIT

Christian Aid Week in Marple, May 2025.

The Churches Together Christian Aid Team in Marple undertook a number of activities around Christian Aid Week to raise money in support of farming communities in Guatemala impacted by climate change. These were:

- The distribution of 5500 Delivery-only envelopes to homes in Marple, Marple Bridge and Mellor.
- Ran a plant and cake sale held at Marple Methodist Church.
- Organised envelope or bucket collections at nine local churches.
- Held a 'Sing Out' collection at St. Marys Catholic Church in Marple Bridge.
- Set up a Marple specific CA web page for on-line giving.

In total, we contributed £5,821 to Christian Aid through donations, sales and Gift Aid to help these communities in Guatemala.

As you can see, the plant and cake sale were busy and good fun, raising over £1000 alone.

As with the Lifeboat Service, they rely totally on public donations, and we were able to give them a generous cheque to help their work. The three Bikers who came were very good, and the charity are happy to give these interesting talks to all sorts of groups.

- School shirts/blouses trousers/skirts
- Polo shirts (all non logo.)
- New socks/underwear
- Pencil cases, drink bottles, lunch boxes

Dialstone Lane Methodist Church

Thank you to all who supported our **Christian Aid Plant Stall** in May. Our total, including envelopes delivered back from neighbours or collected at Church, amounted to £1,635.70! This was an increase on past years.

Dialstone Methodist Church have been very pleased to be visited by all 90 of a local school's Year 3 children, to contribute to their RE learning; this took place over 2 weeks in June. When they arrive they divide into 2 groups, which swop over half way through their morning, so that by the time they come together, both groups have had the same experience. It all has to be done at some speed as our church is a good 20 minute walk from any school and school dinners wait for no-one!

One group goes straight into the Church itself and has the chance to learn about why the church has certain features - pulpit, font organ, communion table, banners, Bible, etc - with a chance to talk about how they might be used in worship. This is all done interactively with the children. They then choose between designing a banner, deciding how the chairs should best be arranged, thinking what they'd like to write a song about or going into the pulpit and deciding what they would say while standing in the pulpit. This last is very popular!

The second group meanwhile has a talk about how we now use our buildings and grounds to promote our Eco-Church interests and why that is important to us as Christians. We also talk about Fairtrade as an expression of our Christian support for justice. They're always interested in the fact that we have an air raid shelter still standing behind the main buildings from when the church was used as school rooms during WWII. We then go into the grounds, everyone having a quiz sheet, looking to fill in the missing vowels on questions about things they can see in the grounds which show we want to care for the earth, God's creatures and for other people. So they can spot nest boxes, a bug hotel, nettle and bramble patches, pots filled with vegetables, strawberries and sensory plants, our defibrillator, benches, and count the solar panels, as well as see the things that help people know the building is a Church - the cross, the noticeboards and our box hedge fish symbol. If there is time the children can then look at a display of Fairtrade food available from local supermarkets and draw the Fairtrade symbol.

When the children come together and after a short service, comprising a short Bible story, prayer and hymn, we give them a drink, and Fairtrade bananas and chocolate samples and the volunteers and staff have a well deserved brew, before setting off back to school. It's a happy event that the children seem to enjoy and we are pleased to be able to share something of what Church means to us.
