Allan Ahlberg, Methodism and intelligence

You may know of Allan Ahlberg, who has recently died. Along with his wife - the late Janet Ahlberg - he was an author of much loved children's books, such as 'Each Peach Pear Plum" and "The jolly Postman".

You might know the style; here are two verses from a poem about Methodism: "Now every week, without much fuss, they talk of Christ who walks with us.

Of faith made real by love and deed - not just in words, but meeting need.

They speak of works — not earning grace, but showing Christ in every place. A loaf of bread, a protest sign, a visit made, a thoughtful line."

Perhaps you like it - but Ahlberg himself did not write it, nor did I and not anyone we know. It was generated by Artificial Intelligence (AI). AI is technology that enables machines to mimic human intelligence, learning, reasoning, and problem-solving to perform tasks autonomously. Generative AI is artificial intelligence that creates new content—text, images, audio, or video—by learning from patterns in data. All the text in italics was written by AI.

Hong Kong Fellowship

In May, I attended two conferences in London on behalf of the Hong Kong Fellowship.

The first one was Global Communities Conference at High Leigh Conference Centre. I used to attend the Lay Worker's Conference there. Unfortunately, the conference no longer happens, possibly due to budget cuts.

The conference venue was a lovely centre. I liked the garden, I even recognised some of the familiar beautiful trees which stood firmly in the grounds. Instantly, I felt the presence of the Holy Spirit who guided me throughout my ministry, ups and downs, joy and sorrow.

It was the first time I attended the Global Communities Conference which is an annual event. I was invited to be a representative from the Hong Kong/Chinese churches/fellowships. It was great to be inspired by some keynote speeches, and meet fellow leaders from diverse backgrounds and different areas.

At first, I noticed that most of the attendees were men with African heritage, I was in a minority. Yet, I engaged with the discussions and shared about how the Hong Kong Fellowship was established, and the current challenges and development. It was encouraging that my voice was being heard during the conference. I hope we can have some exchange visits among different Global Communities, learning and supporting one another.

The second conference was UK-Hong Kong Symposium. It was the third time that I attended. There were many civil Hong Kongers societies from the whole of the UK, around 80 people attended as individuals or represented their groups. Keynote speakers included a MP, human rights activists, Tibetan and Uyghur communities, and leaders of Hong Kongers civil societies from EU and Japan. We had a lot of discussions how to respond to the current situation both in Hong Kong and the UK. The conclusion of the conference was to recruit the next symposium committee members, and a working group to develop a UK-HK Alliance, like the one in Europe.

I observed that some of the groups were more equipped to deal with political issues, while others aim to provide social and cultural support for the Hong Kong communities in different parts of the UK. It reminded me about the identity and mission of our Hong Kong Fellowship. When we were first established in 2023, there were not a single Hongkongese/Cantonese congregation in Stockport. Now, there are at least a couple and they provide weekly services. We have secured an annual budget of £10,000 from the Circuit and Caleb until August 2028. Currently, we are providing a monthly service & a social event, and a weekly English class.

In our next stage of development, I think, we do not need a conventional approach to nurturing our group. There is a gap for a more open and liberal Hong Kong congregation, to care about not just their own faith development, or a narrow evangelical concept, but social justice in the wider community and the world.




What is Wholehearted monthly? Think community organising rally meets immersive spiritual laboratory. It's for anyone committed to a vibrant friendship


