

3Generate is the Methodist Church's youth assembly and takes place in the NEC across a weekend in October. Over 1500 children and young people and their leaders camp in tents inside one of the halls and explore the town that pops up. There are worship concerts, discussion groups, crafts, physical activities, a tech hub with games, animal encounters and so much more.

It's a fantastic opportunity for our young people to realise that they are part of something bigger and explore the good news in ways that are only possible at a different scale.

This year Katie and Jude took four children who have been regulars at Woodley's Funday Monday sessions for the last three years, with ages between 9 and 12. It was a first time for all of them, but they were already talking about going next year before the weekend was over.

We joined the group from the Glossop and Tameside circuit, sharing a coach and camping area and were very grateful for their organisation. We are also grateful to the circuit who paid for the tickets and the district who paid for the coach. This meant that we could offer an amazing weekend away at a very minimal cost to the families.


MENCAP Christmas Carol Service at Dialstone Lane - Monday December 1st 1.00pm


